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Now the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) has released updated breast cancer screening guidelines that recommend that women at average risk be offered annual screening mammograms at age 40. The guidelines also say that if a woman doesn't start having annual mammograms at age 40, regular screening should start at age 50.

New ACOG Guidelines: Annual Mammograms Start at 40
You may need another mammogram before a score can be given. 1—Nothing abnormal is seen. You should continue to have routine screening. 2—Benign conditions, such as cysts, are seen. You should continue to have routine screening. 3—Something is seen that probably is not cancer. A repeat mammogram should be done within 6 months.
